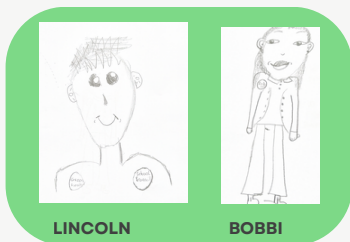


Meet Our Pupil Councillors

My name is Evan and I go to Pye Green Academy.

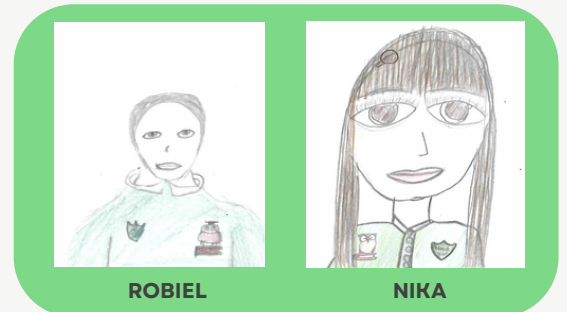

The technology headset was an interesting piece of technology. I liked the design and the shape because it looked comfortable. The material that was used was soft and supportive.

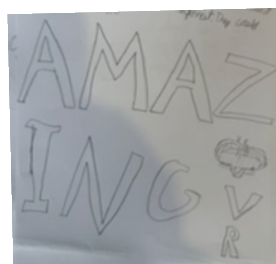
The technology was very high quality, and it was very responsive. It was also very easy to use. I think this is a very good piece of equipment for the classroom.
